

## **Deer Food Plots Guidelines**

- ♦ Not a *substitute* for native food but a *supplement* to native forbs.
- **♦** Stress periods when food plots are needed:
  - Winter (after frost and acorn fall)
  - Late summer/early fall (lactating does)

## **♦** Plant:

- Up to 3% to 5% acreage
- Areas long, narrow next to brush lines (cover areas) (½ acre to 2 acres in size)
- Fence-off from cattle
  - minimum 1 wire (electric) 18" off ground
  - 1<sup>st</sup> wire 18", 2<sup>nd</sup> wire 12" above bottom



## Fall Planting for Winter/Spring (Oct./Nov.)

- Clovers
- Oats, wheat, rye
- Ryegrass
- Alfalfa
- Vetch



## Spring/Summer Planting (April/May)

- Inon/clay cowpeas
- Alyce clover
- American jointvetch
- Soybeans
- Blackeyed peas
- Millet
